books/puzzles, clothing/linens and household items for sale. Questions call the church office at 217.688.2422.




#### **Tuesday Bible Study**

# **Prescription bottles**

Do you throw your empty prescription bottles in the recycle bin? Why not put them in the basket in the entry at church? UWF will send them to Matthew 25, an international humanitarian aid and disaster relief organization helping the poorest of the poor, regardless of race, creed or political persuasion. Matthew 25 accepts donations of empty plastic pill bottles for inclusion in shipments of medical supplies. The pill bottles program fulfills the dual needs of improving medical care in developing countries and caring for our environment. We do need the bottles to have the label removed and be cleaned of residue. Matthew 25 is based out of the State of Ohio.

# Caring for our Environment by UWF

## Styrofoam - what to do with it?

Styrofoam is everywhere in our world today from coffee cups to carry-out from restaurants. What do we do with it when we are done with it? It is technically expanded polystyrene (EPS) and is generally not accepted in curbside recycling programs because it is difficult and expensive to recycle efficiently. Standard recycling facilities lack the necessary equipment to process it.

Reasons it is difficult to recycle:

- 1) the porous nature and common use in food packaging make it challenging to clean and prevent contamination;
- 2) breaks easily and sticks to other materials, contaminating the entire recycling bin;
- it is made from polystyrene, a plastic that doesn't break down naturally, most recycling facilities don't have the necessary densifiers to break down and compact EPS. In Texas Lowe's has been using 2 Greenmax Styrofoam recycling and compacting machines but that doesn't help us in our area.
- It is expensive to recycle. Some estimates (March 2025) show it costs \$3,000 to recycle one ton. On the other hand it costs less than \$100 to recycle one ton of paper.



5) It can take over 500 years or even longer for Styrofoam to decompose in a landfill. Over 5 billion pounds of Styrofoam ends up in our landfills each year with Americans alone throwing away around 25 billion styrofoam cups annually.

So what's the answer? There really isn't a good solution until someone comes up with a similar product that will be environmentally friendly. Some can be used for various projects like DIY crafts and insulation. We can reduce the use and opt for reusable containers and cups. Hopefully sometime a local recycler can handle Styrofoam to keep it out of our landfills. In the meantime we just can't throw it in our weekly recycle pick up.


