

do this each Sunday without our tremendous volunteers. The varieties of goodies is tremendous. We have good bakers in our church. Thank you.



Thank you once again for volunteering to serve our congregation. You are the best!




Tuesday Bible Study

All women are invited to this weekly Bible Study. Contact person is JoAnn Warnes.





Savoy UMC Family,

Isaac and I want to extend our heartfelt thanks for supporting us in the One Winter Night challenge, hosted by CU at Home at the Venu on February 7-8. The goal of this event was to raise \$135,000 to help at least 27 people out of homelessness this year.

Isaac's words encapsulated our night: "It was very cold and heartbreaking to know people live out in the cold." It was only one night for us, but it served as a poignant reminder of God's message in Deuteronomy 15:11



(NCV): "There will always be poor people in the land, so I command you to give freely to your neighbors and to the poor and needy in your land."

We arrived at the Venu around 5:30 pm on February 7th, where Riley greeted us warmly and helped us secure a spot and set up our boxes for the night. Later, I took Isaac to his school dance at Jefferson Middle School, returning to the site afterward. Throughout the evening, we received warm support from Crystal Dillavou, Mark Akers, John Hancock, and a big hug from Aleta.

The event included tables and resources of local ministries, food, guest speakers, and worship with music, fostering a sense of community and compassion. When a speaker asked if anyone had experienced homelessness, about two-thirds in the crowd raised their hands. This ministry is deeply personal to many, and it was heartwarming to see they have found a home and a loving family and are now reaching out to those in need.



Despite the cold night, the wind chill was milder than in previous years. A local news crew initially used our box for their background, but eventually other participants and tents were selected for their interviews. Aside from our box, we had a

small fire pit, and a few neighbor campers came by to share the warmth.

lan, a former Marine who completed several tours in Afghanistan and now lives and works in town, joined us by the fire. During our casual conversation, he shared (in a gentle manner) that "last year, we were told not to bring fire, but it feels warm and good to have one." I smiled and shared that I had a fire extinguisher nearby to show off that I'm a responsible person. And in a good gesture exchange, he revealed that he was a... "Fire Marshal!" I had read the One Winter Night Challenge instructions, which prohibited starting a fire, but I only discovered this rule a week after enjoying a warm meal and a cup of tea

over the fire that night. Do you see a pattern of my clumsiness here? It's like driving a car before getting a license, and speeding in front of a police officer! Thank God, Ian was kind enough not to lock me up that night.

Anyhow, I was able to rest somewhat comfortably in our insulated box, although noisy campers nearby kept me awake all night. Maybe the chill of the night activated their dry humor—they were laughing all night. If you need an energizer bunny, try keeping it out in the cold all night and see if it gets activated! Humor aside, did I show up at church with a swollen face and red eyes on Sunday morning, February 9th? Now you know why.



Your support was invaluable; many of you guided us in finding the right materials and taught us ways to camp out. Special thanks to Larry Kreuger for connecting us with the wonderful folks at Slumberland Furniture, who generously pro-

vided large boxes for our shelter. A few came by to examine how we set up the boxes together and were amazed. We may have more elaborate box campers next year.

And we are grateful to God for those who donated online or through the church, prayed, or continue to minister in various ways. We have raised over \$1,500 and counting - that's adding monies given directly to CU at Home online giving portal and gifts given through our church. Praise God.

I'm once again reminded of Jesus' words of Great Compassion in Matthew 25:40 (NIV):

"Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

Jesus receives and feels your kindness. And you will be rewarded. We pray for a day



when there will be no more homelessness among us; and no more tears, no more hunger, or loneliness. And we can all feast together in our Father's house, sharing the warmth of His love.
